Provisional Accreditation for Post MBBS Diploma Course(s) at Marwari Hospitals by NBEMS

Marwari Hospitals has recently been accredited by the National Board of Examinations in Medical Sciences (NBEMS) with 2(two) Post MBBS courses namely Family Medicine and Obs & amp; Gynae. This is a testimony to the quality of services at the hospital, the most modern infrastructure, competent, experienced and qualified manpower which is available in the hospital. It is indeed a matter of pride for the city based Marwari Hospital as the requirement for approval of such courses by the NBEMS is very stringent.

Family Medicine is a field of specialisation under which medical professionals impart knowledge and training to provide medical treatment of all types of diseases to all members of a family. The professional so trained can offer treatment to family members of all ages and gender.

Diploma in Family Medicine entails medical professionals to offer comprehensive healthcare services, recommend clinical tests, keep track of chronic illness, and also recommend a specialty in case of requirement. Professionals can also learn how to make long term relationships with patients and their families in order to provide continuous medical consultation and support.

Again, Diploma in Gynecology and Obstetrics is a specialized diploma course which can be pursued after completion of MBBS course. It is a post-graduate diploma course spanning over 2 years and is equally divided into 4

semesters. The majority of the course deals with the obstetrics along with maternity care and female reproductive system and diseases. A doctor who completes such a course will be competent to render his/her services to expectant mothers and ladies having gynecological problems.

Doctors would be enrolled into these prestigious courses based on their merit position on an All India Entrance Test conducted by the NBEMS.

It is pertinent to mention that one of the many objectives of the Shree Marwari Databya Aushadhalaya, the parent body of Marwari Hospital, is diffusion of knowledge to the society and starting of these 2 specialised courses is a natural progression of the vision of the organisation. And with the starting of these 2 courses, it is felt that the organisation shall be able to contribute towards creating further manpower in the field of healthcare, which is much needed in India.

To fulfill this objective, our Hospital had applied to the Government of Assam for seeking its approval to start paramedical courses in six streams within this Academic Session. I am pleased to inform that

we have received the approval from the Government of Assam for starting these courses. We are now applying to Srimanta Sankaradeva University of Health Sciences for necessary affiliation. Our Hospital has recently been approved by the National Board of Examinations in Medical Sciences (NBEMS) to start 2(two) Post MBBS courses namely Family Medicine and Obstetrics & Gynaecology. It is indeed a matter of pride for the Marwari Hospital as the requirement for approval for such courses by the NBEMS is very stringent. Hopefully, we will start these courses from the coming session.

To make our staff more patient friendly and increase their efficiency, a training programme "SAMARPAN" is being organised from 05/08/22 by professional faculty. Professional trainer Ms. Sweta Choudhary shall be imparting training in batches of 35 to 40 staff. We have created a total 12 batches out of which 8 are from clinical staff and 4 are from non clinical staff. Ms. Sweta Choudhary has developed different training modules for clinical and non clinical staff and each module consists of 40 hours. There will be 20 sessions. We are optimistic that with this training, our hospital staff will be more patient friendly. Also there will be marked improvement in their working.

Our thanks to Shree Guwahati Gaushala trust for providing us parking space for vehicles in their premises. The space is being suitably developed by us so that sufficient numbers of four wheelers, two wheelers and also ambulances can be parked there. This step by Shree Guwahati Gaushala Trust will also help in removing traffic congestion in front of the Hospital.

We have received approval for 4 seats in family medicine and 2 seats in O&G from the current year. Candidates will be selected by NBE from the all India Entrance test and allotted to us based on merit. Hospital had received Assam Government approval to start 6 paramedical courses within this Academic Session. We are now applying to Srimanta Sankaradeva University for the

necessary affiliation.

Recently, we have appointed Dr. Divya Jyoti Borah, Consultant GI and Hepatobiliary Surgeon who will be available in our hospital from Monday to Saturday from 5:00 PM to 7:00 PM.

We also welcome Dr Pankaj Patwari, Endocrinologist, for his association with Marwari Hospitals. He will be available for consultation on Tuesday, Thursday & Friday from 10 am 11 am.

We have started Vitamin B12 testing in our Laboratory and the report will be delivered to the patient on the same day.

We expect big boost to membership development and subscription committee headed by Shri Pramod Harlalka is doing good job, we expect many new faces getting associated with Marwari Hospitals.

Upgradation of an electrical Panel and installation of DG set.

An electrical panel is basically a main circuit breaker that connects a main power line to a home/hospital Or any organization and distributes electrical currents to the various circuits within that area. Circuit breakers and fuses ensure there are no over-currents during the distribution of power to different circuits.

Marwari Hospitals has also started to upgrade its electrical panel due to increase in day to day high demand of load especially in Multispeciality Block (MSB). Hospital is installing 1600A new AMF panels in a multispeciality block for uninterrupted power supply and smooth functioning of all the departments. Besides, it is doing floor wise cable wiring which will control the power distribution load in every floor of the hospital. Panel installation work is in progress as of now.

Moreover, the hospital is also installing two new synchronizing diesel generator (DG) sets. It has the capacity of 400 KVA per set of DG, and a total 800 KVA is installed in the hospital. Augmentation of the transformer from 500 KVA to 800 KVA will help the hospital in providing continuous power supply. These work is under progress.

Fire fighting demo drill and safety awareness programme

A fire fighting demo drill was organized at hospitals on 6th July 2022 under the supervision of Hospitals's Fire Safety Officer Jayanta Saikia. The Safety Awareness drive and mock drill was conducted in the hospital's premises itself.

All the trainees have given their active participation in the demo drill and experience the practical knowledge in this field to get themselves ready for the unseen dangers and make the mock drill a successful one within the confined time period.
